



Key Community Themes & Priorities

The following themes emerged multiple times throughout the community process include :

- Retain Small town character and sense of history
- Enhance pedestrian and bicycle safety
- Slow down traffic
- Create a place people want to stop and want to be
- Take advantage of San Andreas as a destination (governmental, education, hospital)
- Develop an inviting and comfortable walking environment
- San Andreas should be developed as the “hub” of the County
- Increase opportunities for walking, biking & transit
- Enhance the economic viability and retain experience
- Address youth priorities
- Create places to linger and relax
- Build in connections
- Improve the aesthetic quality & experience
- Incorporate elements of sustainability
- Increase recreational opportunities
